Used to be known as Squaw Peak and is designated as one of Phoenix's Points of Pride. This hike has two main attractions: the Summit Trail which is the most popular. It is about 1.2 miles to the top. The trail itself is rocky, and has a stair effect. There are convenient stops along the way and is rated as a moderate hike. Then there is the Circumference Trail that is 3.75 miles and is much more gradual ascent. It takes longer but kids and dogs can do this one and it is much less crowded.
